

The Churches of St Nicolas, Hawkesley and Immanuel **20th June 2021/ Trinity 3**

There are many personal stories of people who bounced back from a bad situation. We're bouncing back from the pandemic with vaccinations and loosening Covid restrictions. People have bounced back from having Covid and other illnesses. Churches have bounced back from having to shut down for a period of time. And you may know of churches that have bounced back from losing people or from a church split. Paul's ministry had quite a few setbacks, moments and actions that needed the "bounce back".

Paul and his co-workers for Christ always acted with integrity, even in the face of suffering great attacks and hardship. They were committed to declaring the good news about Jesus to the world. In his earlier letter, Paul had spoken of himself and others as 'God's fellow-workers' (1 Corinthians 3:9). The word for "fellow-workers" gives us our English word, 'synergy', which speaks of a combined effort, a cooperation with God if you will.

Paul also adds that they have been treated as if they are sorrowful, poor, and have nothing. But in truth, he insists that they are always rejoicing, and that they possess everything. These words do not deny the reality of earthly circumstances. He had indeed experienced great sorrow in his work for Christ on several occasions. But still Paul states warmly that his heart remains wide open to the church in Corinth and asks them to open their hearts to him again.
