

Government guidance on how to reopen Churches and Places of Worship was issued on Monday. The PCC met on the same day to consider its plan for safely reopening St Nicolas for worship.

It is clear from the Government guidance that this is not a straightforward matter and at the time of the PCC meeting full guidance from the church was still awaited.

We have a duty to look after each other and to act in ways which help stop the spread of this disease. The PCC was clear that we need to have a complete risk assessment before we take the next steps and carefully consider how we respond.
